## Wakeham Workshops at Mile High National

There was a little sun and a little rain (both indoors and out) during the two workshops conducted by Duane Wakeham in conjunction with the Mile High National show in Pueblo.

The week began hot and sunny. Participants in the three day workshop gathered in a studio at the Sangre de Cristo Art Center for a discussion of the technical and philosophical approach to beginning a painting, and then moved to plein air sites to put it all into practice. The Master class convened on a rainy, cool morning in the studio and worked indoors Friday and Saturday as storms outside swept over Pueblo.



Small class sizes in both workshops enabled everyone to have plenty of one on one time with Mr. Wakeham, as they kept up their strength – and sugar level – with M&Ms (and other goodies), and a cooler loaded with beverages. Each workshop ended with a gallery walk and commentary by Mr. Wakeham of the paintings in the Mile High National show.

## 2008 Mile High National

On Saturday August 16, PSC opened the 2008 Mile High National exhibition at the beautiful Sangre de Cristo Art Center in Pueblo, Colorado. Juror Duane Wakeham and many award winners were present for the Champagne and chocolate reception. Gary Huber of Buffalo, Wyoming, was on hand to accept the Best of Show award for his painting “Winter Morning Barns”, a carefully rendered close study of sepia toned buildings and winter trees.

Also present were First Place winners Lorie Merfeld-Batson and Sue McKelvy. Merfeld-Batson’s lively and colorful “Parke County Farm” took honors in the traditional category of work while McKelvy’s “Turkey Trot” mesmerized observers with its graphic sweeps of color and shapes as the abstract/contemporary category winner.

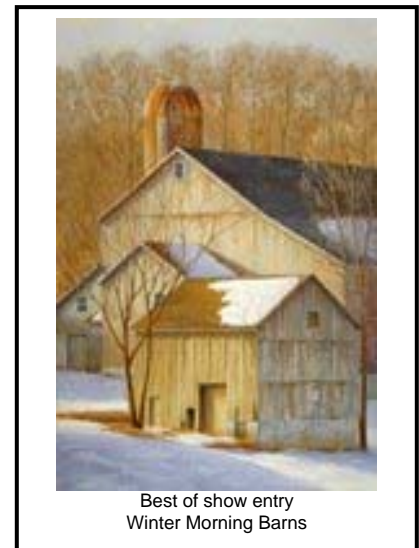

The Golden Triangle Museum District in Denver is hosting a Plein Air Festival, from September 6 to 15. The detailed information is below. It is FREE to participate; there is only a charge if you choose to have your piece juried into the show. In addition, I just found out yesterday that they have added two special painting locations, the Governor's Mansion and the Grant-Humphries Mansion, for September 10. If you wish to paint on location at either or both of these two places on the 10th, you will need to register specifically for that day, in addition to your regular registration.

Let's try to get as many Pastel Society participants as possible! We want to show them that plein air is not just oil painting!

Also, don't forget the Annual Meeting and Paintout in Walden on September 6. The meeting starts at 10AM, at the Electric Coop building, after which we will all disperse to paint around North Park that afternoon and on Sunday.

### **Call for Artists:**

The Golden Triangle Museum District is seeking artists to participate in our 2nd annual Denver Plein Air Arts Festival (formerly High Plein Air). Artists are invited to paint on location in the Golden Triangle on one or more days from September 6 to 15.

Artists may submit one or more pieces up to 30" x 40" on canvas/board/panel or watercolor paper for official festival stamping between September 6 to 15. Stamping locations include Acoma Plaza (next to the DPL), Byers-Evans House Museum, Native American Trading Company, Gallery 1261, Patron's Art and Framing, Michele Mosko Fine Art and more. Participating in the event from September 6 to 15 is free and open to all artists and all media. Artists may paint at any location within the boundaries of the Golden Triangle (between Speer, Colfax and Lincoln). The following venues have given permission to artists to paint on their grounds: Denver Art Museum's Acoma Plaza and Martin Plaza, Colorado History Museum's Plaza, Byers-Evans House Museum and more.

Artists have the option of entering one or more pieces (no limit) completed during the event into the juried competition (\$10 per entry). Cash and prizes will be awarded. Accepted works will be exhibited at The Denver Public Library, 7th floor from Nov 14 to Dec 31, 2008. An opening reception will be held on Friday, Nov 14 from 6 to 9 pm.

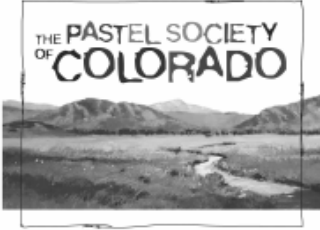
